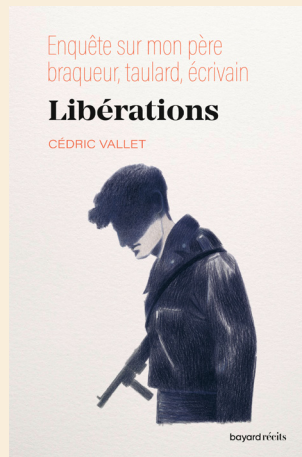

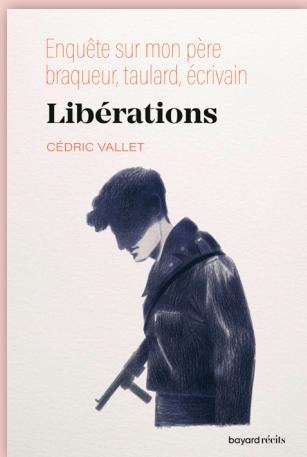

# Gangster vs Activist

CÉDRIC VALLET

**NARRATIVE NON FICTION**

**THEMES: VIOLENCE, DELINQUENCY, POLICE, MARSEILLE**

**Through a father's silence, this book explores crime in 1960s–70s Marseille, the harshness of justice, and the political fascination with violence—when revolt becomes an excuse for brutality, even within the family.**

At the crossroads of personal search and journalistic work, this book casts a human light on crime in late-1960s Marseille. Through the story of an upper-middle-class man from Provence who broke with social and religious conventions and drifted into delinquency and brutality—sometimes under political colours—it also tells a broader history: that of Marseille and crime, of justice and its severity in the 1970s, of failing civil protection services, and police questioning methods.

This inquiry probes the backstage of violence and its ambiguity, where political argument or legitimate revolt can justify the unjustifiable. It examines how political commitment may excuse brutality that spreads into the domestic sphere, while evoking the fascination of part of the radical left with violence in an attempt to uncover its deepest sources.

Journalist **Cédric Vallet** covers Belgian social news for Alter échos and European news for various publications including Alternatives économiques, Le Monde and Libération.

# Where Have My Dead Gone?

ÉRIC FIAT

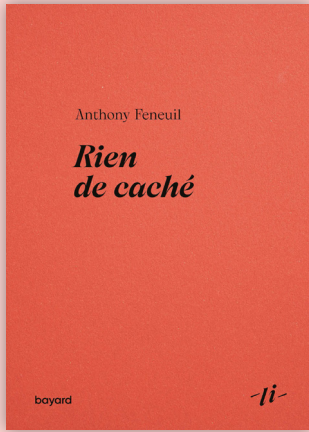

**Facing the mystery of death and the refusal of oblivion, this book gives voice to the departed. Through their lives and deaths, it reflects on what we owe our dead—and how our time struggles to acknowledge them.**

Death remains a mystery, without assured answers: another life, a meeting “in God”, a “last abode”, or, as Levinas suggests, a departure “without leaving address”. This uncertainty is precisely what commands respect.

Because I wish my dead another fate than oblivion, another place than the waters of the Lethe, and because I believe that in each of them something deserves not to die, I tell their lives, their deaths, and what followed. In the lineage of A. Cohen’s *Book of My Mother*, this book becomes that of “my dead”, while questioning how our time does—or does not—make room for the dead.

**Éric Fiat** is a professor at the University of Paris-Est Marne-la-Vallée and a member of the scientific council in bioethics at the Collège des Bernardins. A specialist in applied moral and ethical philosophy, his work focuses on human fragility in the broad sense. He is the author, among others, of *La Pudeur* (with Adèle Van Reeth, Plon, 2016) and *Ode à la fatigue*, L’Observatoire, 2018.

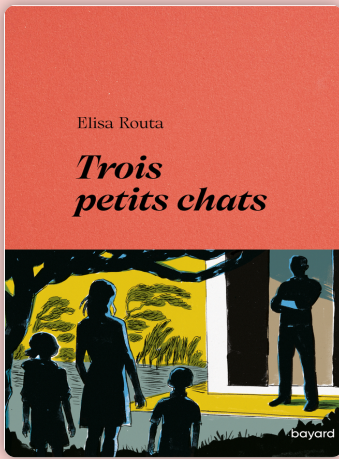

**What does the election of an American pope reveal about a world where empires, ideologies and religious influence are resurging?**

Pope Francis died on April 21, 2025. On May 8, Leo XIV was elected to lead the Church. For eighteen days, the seat of power stood vacant. The Vatican exposed its political machinery and its relationship to the world. Electing a pope from the United States at a moment when Trumpism is reshaping the international landscape is far from insignificant.

Special correspondent of La Croix in Rome, Mikael Corre recounts a decisive moment. Through gestures, silences, and details, he examines the different worldviews and conceptions of power, and the fundamental questions that run through the Church.

**Mikael Corre** is a journalist at La Croix, corresponding with the Vatican since 2024. He is the author, among others, of 'Central' (Bayard, 2023), adapted into a graphic novel under the title 'Anatomie d'un commissariat' (Bayard, 2024).

# Three Little Kittens

Seen through the eyes of two siblings, the novel depicts a suffocating domestic world where survival depends on silence and escape on the unbridled fury of childhood—a tense, poetic debut haunted by the echo of *The Three Little Kittens*.

Born in 1984, **Elisa Routa** lives and works in Anglet, in the Basque Country, where she devotes herself mainly to reading and writing. *Three Little Cats* is her first novel.

# Five Silences, Writers' Final Words

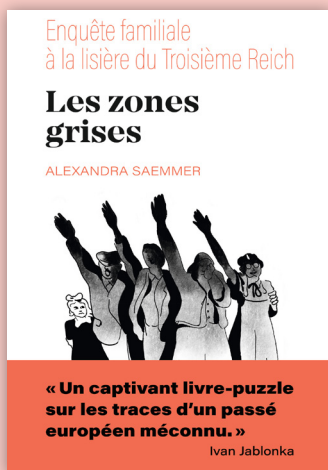
**Five silences. Five voices gone quiet—too soon.**

A writer is alive, writing—and then, suddenly, it is over. Franz Kafka, Virginia Woolf, Albertine Sarrazin, Georges Perec, and Roberto Bolaño all died between the ages of twenty-nine and fifty-nine, each leaving behind a body of work abruptly cut short. In this powerful book, Raphaël Meltz focuses on that moment of rupture, reconstructing the writers' final hours through words, facts, dates, and testimonies, and examining the instant when life gives way to posterity.

Drawing on extensive research into journals, letters, interviews, and biographies, Meltz revisits the last words of these five iconic figures, unveiling new and sometimes unpublished material. At once an intellectual inquiry and a literary experience, the book reflects on time, death, and legacy, and on the fragile boundary between silence and survival through literature.

**Raphaël Meltz** is the author of *Après* (Le Tripode, 2025, 5,500 copies sold) and the graphic novel *Des Vivants* (Éditions 2042, 30,000 copies sold; Prix Goscinny for Best Young Screenwriter at the Angoulême International Comics Festival 2022). He also writes under the pseudonym Hadrien Klent, notably *Paresse pour tous* (Le Tripode, 90,000 copies sold) and *La vie est à nous* (Le Tripode, 25,000 copies sold). His next novel, *Jour zéro*, will be published in May 2026.

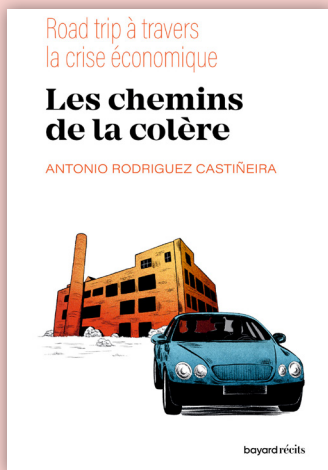

The book begins with her Sudeten family in Czechoslovakia and the unanswered questions surrounding her maternal grandfather, a Wehrmacht soldier who disappeared on the Eastern Front.

Through meticulous archival research and narrative reconstruction, Saemmer pieces together a story long silenced, using fiction to probe the ambiguities of family memory, national history, and collective responsibility. The result is a powerful reflection on war, identity, and the invisible wounds of the twentieth century—one that confronts the past while holding out the fragile possibility of understanding and healing.

### What if the numbers we write about have real lives behind them?

Antonio Rodriguez Castiñeira, a seasoned economic journalist, brings together global finance and personal history in a journey where abstract policies become painfully real. After years covering international summits, the 2008 financial crisis took on new meaning when his mother fell seriously ill, revealing the human cost behind the numbers he once analyzed.

Fifteen years after the collapse of Lehman Brothers, Castiñeira travels by taxi from Galicia to Switzerland, meeting Spanish emigrants along the way—those who left, returned, or stayed behind. Through their stories of loss, resilience, and anger, he traces the scars of austerity and economic upheaval, offering a deeply human and political portrait of a fractured Europe still reckoning with its past.

**Antonio Rodriguez** is a journalist specialising in economics. He is the author, with Denis Pommier, of *Larmes de ma vigne* (Cherche Midi, 2020) and with Camille Beaurain *Agricultrice, une vie à part* (Robert Laffont, 2021).

# The Fury and the Thrill

LAURENT LARCHER

THEMES: SOCIOLOGY, JOURNALISM

**Confronted with extreme violence, a reporter questions what shifts within us. This text is the account of a threshold crossed, where distant history collides with our most immediate present.**

In December 2013, during the first days of the French intervention in the Central African Republic, I witnessed a lynching while reporting on the war with the young photographer Camille Lepage. I had seen extreme violence before, but never so closely: this time, the killers made room for us among them—ordinary women and men, people like you and me. Caught in this surge of collective violence, Camille lost her life.

This text is both a firsthand account and an investigation into mass violence, written against the easy dismissal—“this is Africa.” What I saw was not violence before civilisation, but violence at the crossroads of our civilisations, echoing the great texts of ancient Greece and the wars of our own recent past. Faced with the unbearable, I cling to culture and history to resist the abyss, convinced that these distant voices speak not of others, but of us all—of a single humanity we must learn to confront and share.

A senior reporter at La Croix and a specialist in Sub-Saharan Africa, **Laurent Larcher** covers wars and Defense. He is the author of several books, including ***Une énigme française: Pourquoi les trois quarts des Juifs en France n'ont pas été déportés***, with Jacques Semelin (Albin Michel, 2022), and ***Papa, qu'est-ce qu'on a fait au Rwanda ?*** (Seuil, 2024).

# The Sentimental Story of My Hair

ESTELLE SARAH-BULLE

"In Paris, Brussels or Pointe-à-Pitre, it often happens that strangers speak to me. The last time I was there, a woman came up to me on the train that was taking me home. She handed me a folded piece of paper with her phone number written on it. She was a Ghanaian woman. She told me gently that I had to come and see her because my hair didn't look good like that. She was in Saint Denis.

I navigate between two worlds: on the one hand, that of the 99% white executives I used to meet every day in my previous professional life and who I still meet sometimes.

If I didn't have my hair in common with the morning shift workers, with those threatened by the loss of their residency cards, who send their children to school in the hope of a better life, who speak little French and live in run-down neighbourhoods or abandoned rural villages, would I be on the margins, me, who painfully managed to buy a nice house in a small bourgeois town? Would I, who had the opportunity to study for a long time, still have experiences in common with a large part of the modern proletariat without my hair? With frizzy hair comes a whole shared history".

**Estelle-Sarah Bulle** was born in France. She has Caribbean origins. She has published three novels by Liana Levi, ***Là où les chiens aboient par la queue*** (Stanislas Prize for the first novel), ***Les Étoiles les plus filantes et Basses terres***, and also writes for children.

# A Woman Of Her Time

JOSÉPHINE LEBARD

THEME: SOCIETY

***"I figure you must have smuggled things to us. Maybe even in spite of yourself. It remains to be seen what."***

- A rich, well-documented text on the history of housewives during the 1950ies/60ies, a «subject» little dealt with by sociologists and a blind spot for feminists.
- As a young feminist, Joséphine Lebard questions the place of women in the home. What have they passed on to their daughters? What did they transmit?
- A story about grief and family memory.

With tenderness and self-mockery, Joséphine Lebard tells the story of her late grandmother, her renunciations, her pains and her escapes. She analyzes with finesse the transmission that takes place between generations, and revisits the figure of housewives during the 1950ies/60ies.

Millions of lives that have been ignored by feminists and sociologists alike. Between sensitive personal recollections and a documentary approach, the author shows how these women played a role, almost in spite of themselves, in the collective destiny of women in the twentieth century and right up to the present day.

**Joséphine Lebard** is a journalist. She works with various French media (Arte, Le Monde, Causette, Enlarge your Paris), covering topics such as working-class neighborhoods, education and culture. She is also a published author (Éditions Stock, La Découverte).

# A Foreign Mother

DANIÈLE LAUFER

THEMES: HISTORY, TESTIMONY

**A tale in two voices, those of the author and her mother, about transmission and traumatic memory.**

- Danièle Laufer recounts her childhood, bathed in Casablanca sunshine and suffocated by her mother's silence.
- Underlying the story, the author questions the way in which the memory of trauma is transmitted from generation to generation. The Holocaust in particular.
- This book recounts the unique moment when a mother and her daughter finally met.
- A powerful double testimony.

This autobiographical text is a belated and unexpected encounter between a mother who survived the Bergen Belsen concentration camp and her daughter, who struggles to grow up and to obtain her mother's tenderness. It's also a universal tale that probes the way of being in the world after a trauma and its impact on the mother-daughter relationship.

**Danièle Laufer** is a writer and journalist. She has published books for young people and a number of highly acclaimed works on society, health and psychology, including ***Le Tako Tsubo: Un chagrin de travail*** (Les Liens qui Libèrent, 2017), ***L'Année du Phénix. La première année de la retraite*** (LLL, 2013) and ***La Danse du couple***, with Serge Hefez (Hachette Littératures, 2002). She is interested in the family, filiation and identity. In 1996, Bayard Éditions published ***La Vie empêchée***, which recounts her mother's childhood in Germany and her deportation.

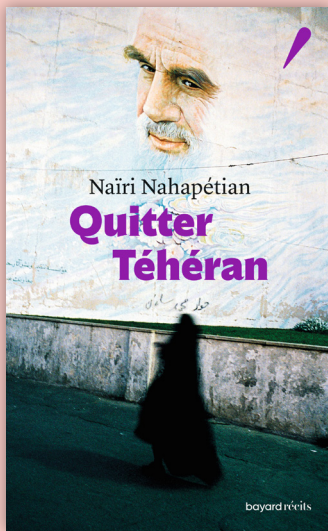

# Leave Tehran

NAÏRI NAHAPÉTIAN

THEMES: SOCIETY, IRAN

**“ ‘I know you won’t be coming back.’ It was with these words that my father said goodbye to us at the airport when we left Tehran in August 1980 (...). Forty years later, I’ve managed to understand why my father was stuck in Iran while we were in Paris.”**

- A family investigation between Paris and Iran, from 1979 to the present day
- A fluid style that makes contemporary Iranian history easily accessible

- A story that sheds light on the current protests in Iran

At the age of nine, Naïri Nahapétian fled Iran’s Islamic Revolution with her mother, leaving behind a father who would never be able to join them. Years later, after a period of deep depression, the crime novelist turns to her own past, launching a family investigation to understand what separated her from him—an autobiography that unfolds like a detective story.

Through memories of childhood in Iran, adolescence in France, and a return to Tehran in the 1990s, Nahapétian weaves personal history with political upheaval. Her story sheds light on the impact of the revolution, particularly on Iran’s Armenian minority, and shows how exile, language, and culture shape identities that are multiple, fractured, and deeply marked by history.

Born in Tehran, which she left after the 1979 Islamic Revolution. She is a journalist and the author of novels for both young readers and adults.

# After The April Rain

ISABELLE DARRAS

THEMES: HISTORY, MEMORY, RESILIENCE

**Thirty years after the Tutsi genocide, the author travels to Rwanda with one question in mind: how do you live when you've survived the worst - extreme violence, the loss of your own people and the attempted eradication of one's culture?**

- A humanist text, embodied by extraordinary characters whose scars move us

At the time of the events, the author was in refugee camps in neighboring Democratic Republic of Congo, working as a young French journalist. Almost 3 decades later, Isabelle Darras embarks on a veritable quest for meaning through her encounters with Chantal, who welcomes and guides her; Agatha and her accomplices, who have set up a women's discussion group; Delphine and Agnès, who live alone; and all those who have chosen to speak out or remain silent. And all those who have put their families back together.

Son of the Russian writer Andrei Siniavski, a Soviet dissident, **Iegor Gran** arrived in France at the age of ten, Yegor Siniavski grew up there. He studied engineering at the Ecole centrale Paris (class of 1987). In parallel to his work as an engineer, he began a career as a writer and chose as his pseudonym the surname of his wife, Gran.

In 2003, he won the Grand Prize for Black Humour. From 2011, he worked at **Charlie Hebdo**. He is a bestselling author, acclaimed by readers and booksellers. He published all his work at POL or Les Échappés and now at Bayard.

# All That Is Human

In 2001, I launched a lecture program for children aged 10 and over. The idea was to cross-reference children's questions on all subjects with answers from adults such as philosophers, artists and scientists...

Today, these lectures have numbered well over a hundred, and 70 of them have been published by Bayard in the **Les petites conférences** collection that Frédéric Boyer suggested I create in 2004, directly in the wake of the experiment begun in Montreuil in 2001 with the great Hellenist Jean-Pierre Vernant.

Philosophers, astronomers, physicists, botanists, gardeners, musicians, historians, anthropologists, choreographers and even magicians generously lent themselves to the game.

Although the topics are open-ended and of interest to all ages, **Les Petites Conférences** are primarily aimed at children, requiring special attention on the part of the speakers to ensure a strong, effective movement of friendship across the generations. This exchange is made manifest by the question-and-answer session that follows the lecture itself in each volume.
